CODE OF GUIDANCE

CHRISTMAS DECORATIONS

This Code of Guidance addresses the issue of putting up decorations at Christmas and offers the following guidelines which should be observed:

- Decorations need to be put up in a safe manner decided upon by means of a risk assessment taking account of the room structure and layout. Proper access equipment should be used. e.g. step ladders. Chairs MUST NOT be used to stand upon.
- 2. Decorations should be secured by means of adhesive materials in preference to pins and nails.
- 3. Decorations should be away from sources of ignition such as hot surfaces and naked flames.
- 4. Walls and ceilings, which are designed to act as fire breaks, should not be festooned with decorations. If in doubt, ask your supervisor or manager.
- 5. Pins or nails should not attach decorations to any walls or ceilings containing asbestos. As a guide, buildings less than 30 years old are unlikely to contain asbestos.
- 6. Decorations, displays and trees should not obscure:-
 - (i) Fire exit signs or other safety signs.
 - (ii) Fire alarm break glass panes.
 - (iii) Fire extinguishers.
 - (iv) Sprinkler heads.
 - (v) Smoke detectors.
 - (vi) Ventilation systems etc.
- 7. Christmas lights must be electrically tested, and labelled so, by a competent person before use to ensure that they are safe.
- 8. Christmas lights should be plugged into the nearest convenient socket outlet N.B. the use of multi adapters is strongly discouraged. Care should be taken to avoid trailing cables.
- 9. When mains voltage is used the risk of injury is high if the equipment is defective, damaged or there is a fault and therefore, Residual Current Devices (R.C.D.) should be used to ensure that the current is properly cut off if contact is made with any live parts.
- 10. Christmas lights must be switched off and unplugged when the office is unattended.
