Fearless.org is a UK-based youth outreach service run by the charity Crimestoppers.

Their talks focus on:

- Building resilience and managing peer pressure.
- Understanding the law and personal responsibility.
- Developing empathy and respect for others.
- Reducing fear and uncertainty around crime.



## Tidy Butt

Tidy Butt is a mental health and wellbeing charity based in South Wales.

Their talks focus on:

- Promoting emotional literacy and reducing stigma around mental health.
- Encouraging self-reflection and resilience through practical wellbeing activities.
- Building agency and confidence to talk about feelings and seek help.
- Reinforcing the idea that mental health is for everyone, not just those in crisis.

## Big Ideas Wales

Big Ideas Wales is a Welsh Government programme, delivered through Careers Wales and Business Wales, that inspires young people to develop enterprise skills and explore entrepreneurship by:

- Meeting role models and hearing how entrepreneurs overcame setbacks.
- Encouraging pupils to imagine positive futures and set personal goals.
- Enabling pupils to learn to weigh risks, think creatively, and solve problems.



## Brook

Brook is one of the leading organisations in the UK for Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) and youth-friendly health support.

Their talks focus on:

- Promoting respect, empathy, and healthy communication.
- Helping pupils feel comfortable asking questions and making informed decisions.
- Equipping pupils to navigate peer pressure, online risks, and early adolescence challenges.



## Race Equality First

Race Equality First is the leading race equality charity in Wales, dedicated to tackling racial discrimination, supporting victims of hate crime, and promoting equality and inclusion across communities.

Their talks focus on:

- Encouraging pupils to understand and value diversity.
- Helping pupils learn about equality as a human right.
- Equipping pupils to challenge discrimination and support peers.
- Raising awareness of hate crime and how to report it safely.



## Just Like Us

Just Like Us is the UK's LGBT+ young people's charity.

Their talks focus on:

- Equipping pupils to learn to value diversity and understand different lived experiences.
- Promoting a school culture where bullying and discrimination are challenged.

## BAWSO

**BAWSO is an all-Wales charity that provides specialist support to Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) and migrant individuals affected by domestic abuse, sexual violence, human trafficking, Female Genital Mutilation (FGM), forced marriage, honour-based violence, and modern slavery.**

Their talks focus on:

- The right to safety and dignity, regardless of background.
- Awareness of cultural diversity and the importance of challenging harmful stereotypes.

## OddBalls Foundation

**The OddBalls Foundation focuses on testicular cancer awareness. They run workshops and talks to break down stigma around men's health and encourage early detection.**

Their talks focus on:

- Introducing pupils to the importance of body awareness and early detection of health issues.
- Breaking down stigma and encouraging open conversations about topics that are often seen as embarrassing.
- Empowering young people to take responsibility for their own health.

## Educate Against Islamophobia

**Educate Against Islamophobia is dedicated to combating Islamophobia through education, recognising that intolerance often stems from misinformation or lack of understanding.**

Their talks aim to:

- Encourage pupils to understand and value diversity.
- Teach that freedom from discrimination is a human right.
- Equip pupils to challenge prejudice and support peers.
- Promotes inclusion and reduces bullying based on faith or identity.
