Under the 1988 Education Reform Act we are no longer empowered to insist on a direct charge for such activities, but we are allowed to ask for voluntary contributions of the full cost. The law now requires us to ensure that no child is excluded from trips arranged wholly or mainly in school hours because parents have not made a voluntary contribution. However, we must make it clear that no funds exist for this activity, and if parents who wish their children to take part do not make a voluntary contribution of the full cost, the trip will have to be cancelled.
