Year 10 External GCSE Exams

For some subjects it is permitted and appropriate for pupils to sit some exams at the end of year 10, obviously the advantage being that they will then have fewer exams to sit at the end of Y11. For other subjects, exams are not available at the end of year 10, or pupils are not yet ready to take them. We have carefully planned for the exams which it is most beneficial for Y10 to undertake this summer.

Y10 External GCSE Written Exams - Summer 2026

- **All** pupils will sit one Maths exam towards their double award GCSE in Mathematics and Numeracy - this counts for 30% of the qualification
- **All** pupils will sit one English exam towards their double award GCSE in English & Language and Literature - this counts for 15%
- **All** pupils will sit three Science exams, one in Biology, one in Chemistry & one in Physics. For Double Award Science, each exam will count for 15% - a total of 45% of their final grade. For Triple Award Science, each exam will count for 45% of their individual Biology, Chemistry and Physics final grades
- **Pupils studying GCSE Business** will sit the Unit 1 module which counts for 30% of their final grade
- **Pupils studying GCSE Geography** will sit the Unit 1 module which counts for 30% of their final grade
- **Pupils studying GCSE History** will sit one module which counts for 25% of their final grade
- **Pupils studying GCSE RS** will sit the Unit 1 module which counts for 30% of their final grade

So, Y10 pupils will sit a maximum of 9 external written examinations spread over a period of 5 school weeks.

Normal lessons will continue around these exams with revision taking place during lessons and in extra revision sessions.

Assessments in Other Subjects

Depending on the subjects they take, pupils may be completing on-going controlled assessment work which contributes to their GCSE grade as part of their normal lessons and preparation throughout Y10 and Y11.

- **English NEA - Group Discussions: Week Beginning 22nd June**
- **Music Solo Performance NEA: 30th June - 3rd July**

Pupils in Y10 may also sit internal school assessments in some subjects before the end of the summer term. These do not contribute to their actual GCSE grades, but provide valuable information about progress made and help to inform next steps in learning. Further details about these will be shared with pupils directly by their teachers.

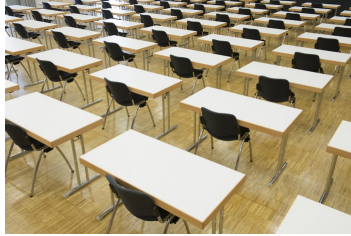
Other Information



Breakfast Last Minute Revision and Q&A Sessions

The time immediately before a big morning exam is particularly stressful. Often students have not slept well, they may not have eaten and might want to check key points, ask specific questions or simply get some reassurance from their teachers. With this in mind, we will arrange for the canteen to be open from 8am. Pupils can meet their friends and speak to subject specialists and the achievement team in a calm supportive environment anytime in the hour before their morning exam. In addition, we will provide students with free fruit, water and toast for that last minute rehydration and energy boost.

Please note that students will need to bring a clear water bottle if they wish to take water into the exam.

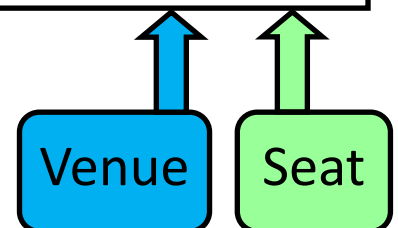

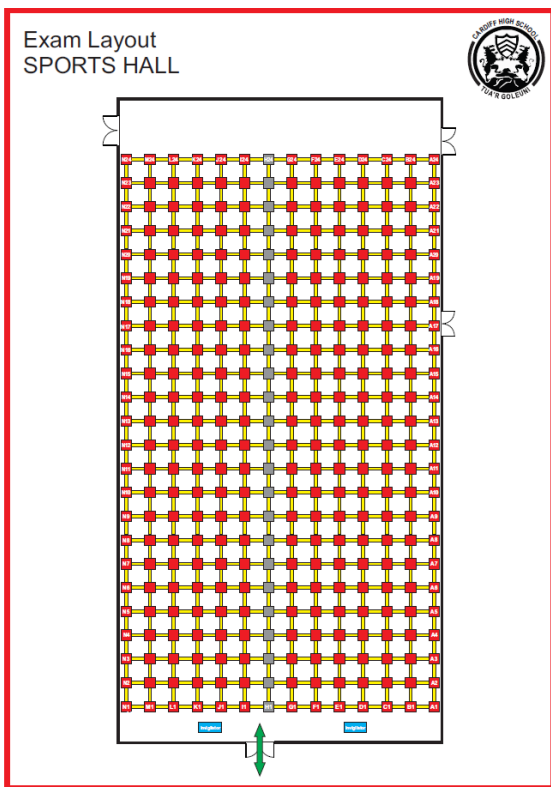

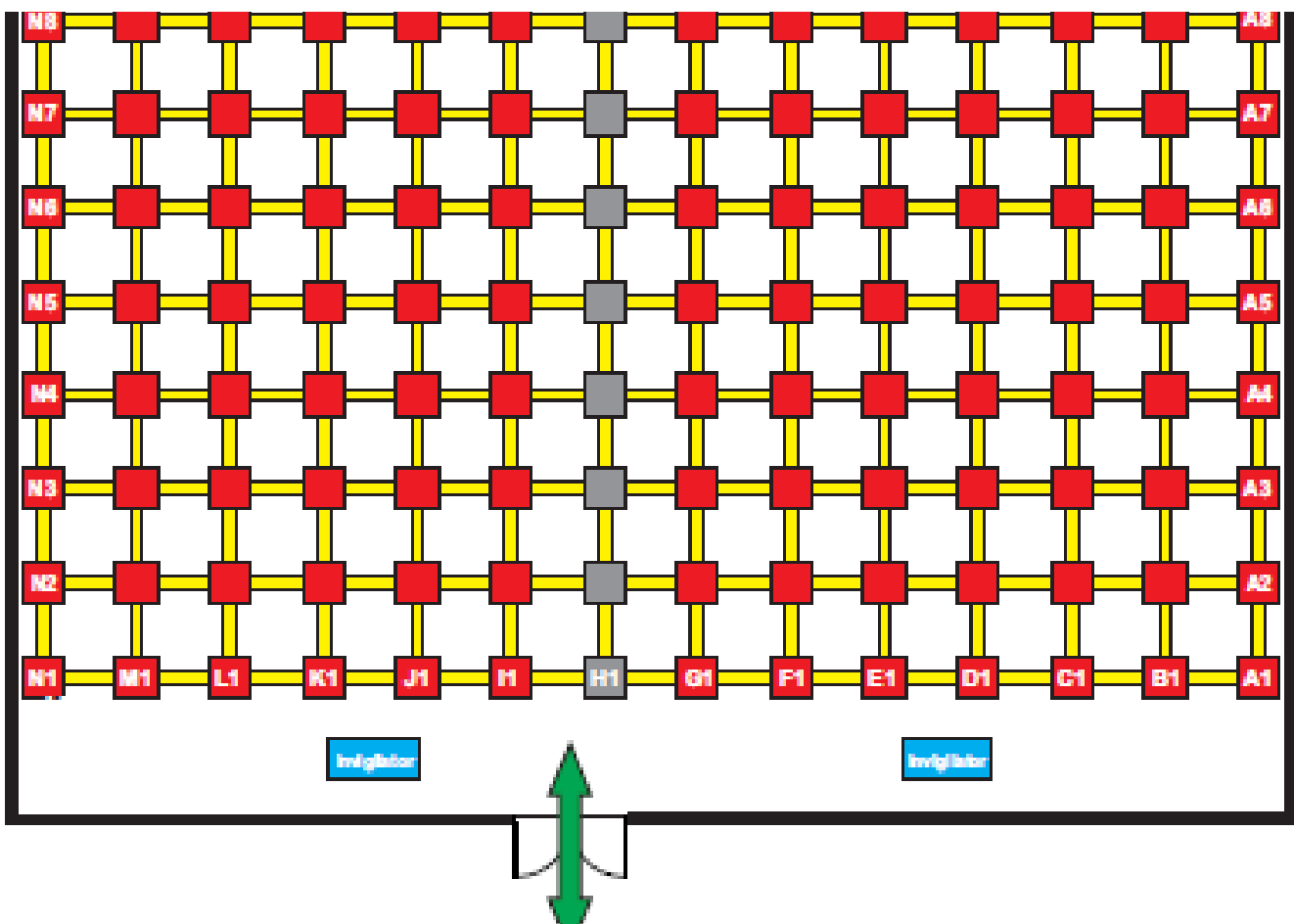

Where do I sit?



- Most Y10 exams will take place in the Sports Hall
- Each column of desks has a letter - A on the right of the hall through to N on the left
- Seats are then numbered from 1 at the front to 24 at the back of the hall
- Your seat number for each exam will be on your timetable and also displayed on the list outside the venue
- Other venues will be arranged in a similar way

- *Each student will be given an exam ID card*
- *Students are required to place their ID card on their desk when they sit down in the hall so that registers can be taken efficiently*
- *This is also a useful way to remind students of their candidate and centre number which is needed to complete the front cover of every exam*
- **Please put your exam ID card in your pencil case so that you remember to bring it to every exam**
- *If you lose your ID card please see someone in the achievement team to get a replacement*



Things To Remember

- **Morning exams start at 9am - You need to be at the exam venue by 8.45am for a morning exam**
- Your timetable tells you the venue and your seat number for each exam
- On the morning of an exam, go straight to the canteen from 8am to 8.40am (no need to go to registration, this will be done in the canteen or the exam venue). At 8.40am go to the exam venue
- **Afternoon exams start at 1.30pm - You need to be at the exam venue by 1.15pm for an afternoon exam**
- If you have an afternoon exam, we will arrange for you to have an early lunch so that you can get to your exam on time

Things to remember for each exam:-

- ✓ Your candidate ID card
- ✓ A **black** pen & at least one spare (you must write in black ink)
- ✓ Clear pencil case with pens, pencils, ruler, eraser
- ✓ Ruler, pencil, compass & protractor & calculator for Maths & Science exams
- ✓ No phones, airpods or watches
- ✓ Clear water bottle—no labels or designs

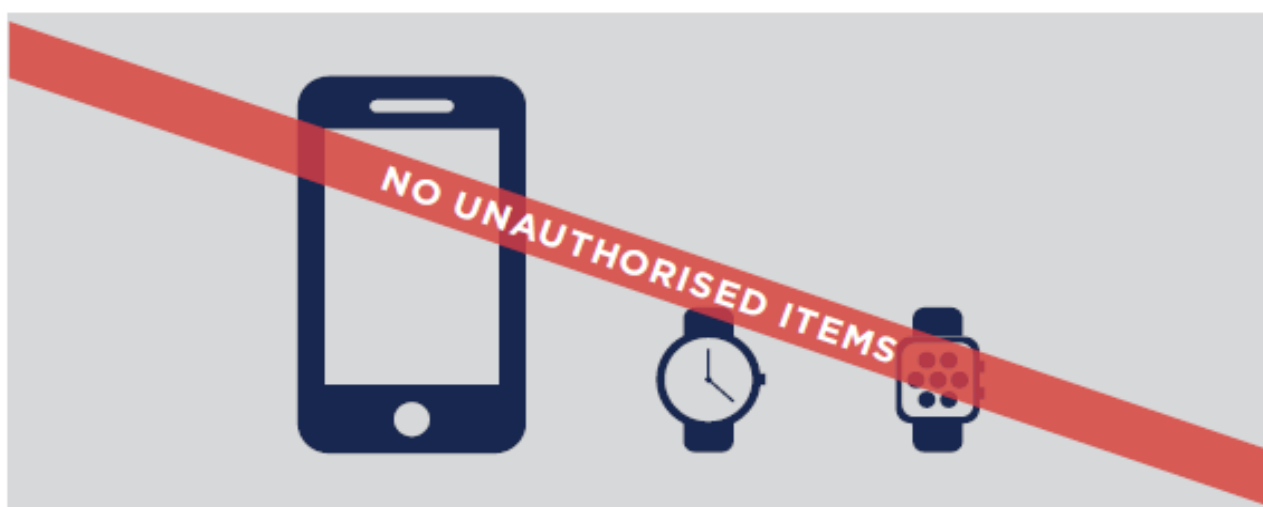

This document has been written to help you. Read it carefully and follow the instructions. If there is anything you do not understand, especially which calculator you may use, ask your teacher.

A Regulations – Make sure you understand the rules	
1	Be on time for all your exams. If you are late, your work might not be accepted.
2	Do not become involved in any unfair or dishonest practice during the exam.
3	If you try to cheat or break the rules in any way, you could be disqualified from all your exams.
4	You must not take into the exam room any unauthorised material, including: a) notes; b) earphones or earbuds (e.g. AirPods), mobile phones, MP3/4 players or similar devices, smart devices, smart glasses, tablets (e.g. iPads or iPods); c) a watch. Any pencil cases taken into the exam room must be see-through. Remember: possession of unauthorised material is breaking the rules, even if you do not intend to use it, and you will be subject to sanctions and possible disqualification.
5	Do not use correcting pens, fluid or tape, erasable pens, highlighters or gel pens in your answers.
6	Do not talk to or try to communicate with or disturb other candidates once you have entered the exam room.
7	You must not write inappropriate, obscene or offensive material.
8	If you leave the exam room unaccompanied by an invigilator before the exam has finished, you will not be allowed to return.
9	Do not borrow anything from another candidate during the exam.
B Information – Make sure you attend your exams and bring what you need	
1	Know the dates and times of all your exams. Arrive at least ten minutes before the start of each exam.
2	If you arrive late for an exam, report to the invigilator running the exam.
3	If you arrive more than one hour after the published starting time for the exam, you may not be allowed to take it.
4	Only take into the exam room the pens, pencils, erasers and any other permitted equipment needed for the exam.
5	You must write clearly and in black ink. Coloured pencils or inks may be used for only diagrams, maps, charts, etc., unless the instructions printed on the front of the question paper state otherwise.
C Calculators, dictionaries and computer spellcheckers	
1	You may use a calculator unless you are told otherwise.
2	If you use a calculator: a) make sure it works properly; check that the batteries are working properly; b) clear anything stored in its memory; c) remove any parts such as cases, lids or covers which have printed instructions or formulae; d) do not bring into the exam room any operating instructions or prepared programs.
3	Do not use a dictionary or computer spellchecker unless you are told otherwise.

D Instructions during the exam	
1	Always listen to the invigilator. Always follow their instructions.
2	Tell the invigilator at once if: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) you think you have not been given the right question paper or all of the materials listed on the front of the paper; b) the question paper is incomplete or badly printed; c) you think you have not been given the expected access arrangement(s).
3	Read carefully and follow the instructions printed on the question paper and/or on the answer booklet.
4	Do not start writing anything until the invigilator tells you to fill in all the details required on the front of the question paper and/or the answer booklet. Do not open the question paper until you are told that the exam has begun.
5	Remember to write your answers within the designated sections of the answer booklet.
6	Do your rough work on the proper exam stationery. Cross it through and hand it in with your answers. Make sure you add your candidate details to any additional answer sheets that you use, including those used for rough work.
E Advice and assistance	
1	If, on the day of the exam, you feel that your work may be affected by ill health or any other reason, tell the invigilator.
2	Put up your hand during the exam if: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) you have a problem and are not sure what you should do; b) you do not feel well; c) you need more paper.
3	You must not ask for, and will not be given, any explanation of the questions.
F At the end of the exam	
1	If you have used more than one answer booklet and/or any supplementary answer sheets, place them in the correct order. Place any loose additional answer sheets inside your answer booklet. Make sure you add your candidate details to any additional answer sheets that you use. For CCEA examinations, any loose additional sheets should be placed behind your script.
2	Do not leave the exam room until told to do so by the invigilator.
3	Do not take any stationery from the exam room. This includes the question paper, answer booklets (used or unused), rough work or any other materials provided for the exam.
This information must be made available to all candidates in advance of their examination(s) for each series. It may be provided electronically to candidates or in hard copy paper format.
